

Cool Fall Nights, Cloudy Days by Lee Vanderpool

Fall has begun to show its face. Days are cooler and nights have been downright chilly. With the height of the hurricane season still to come, it seems a little premature to be thinking of winter but think of it we must. Fertilizing of your trees should have been changed to only 0-10-10 with light fish emulsion or cotton seed meal applications to pines and junipers. The conifers do not cease growth in our climate as do the deciduous trees so must continue to get some nourishment throughout the year, even on the coldest of Januarys.

Time also to begin acclimatizing your tropicals for winter by moving them into a more shaded place such as under a tree or onto a back porch or deck. They need to receive the shade so they can better handle overwintering in a sheltered place. If tropicals get too chilly, they will drop their leaves but will perk up again if given warmth and sun. Better not to take chances, though, and protect them as temperatures fall below 50 degrees F.

Keep to your watering schedule.
Remember, more trees are lost from lack of proper watering practices than from almost anything else. Water if the soil is dry down to the first joint of your finger. If the tree is wilted, bottom water with warm water for about 30 minutes then drain. The plant should recover its turgidity shortly. Be especially careful and watchful if there is a dry wind blowing since a tree in a bonsai pot can desiccate in as little as an hour.
